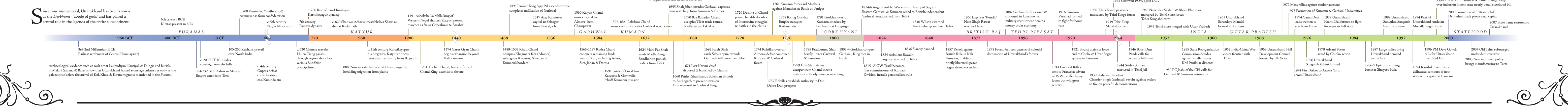

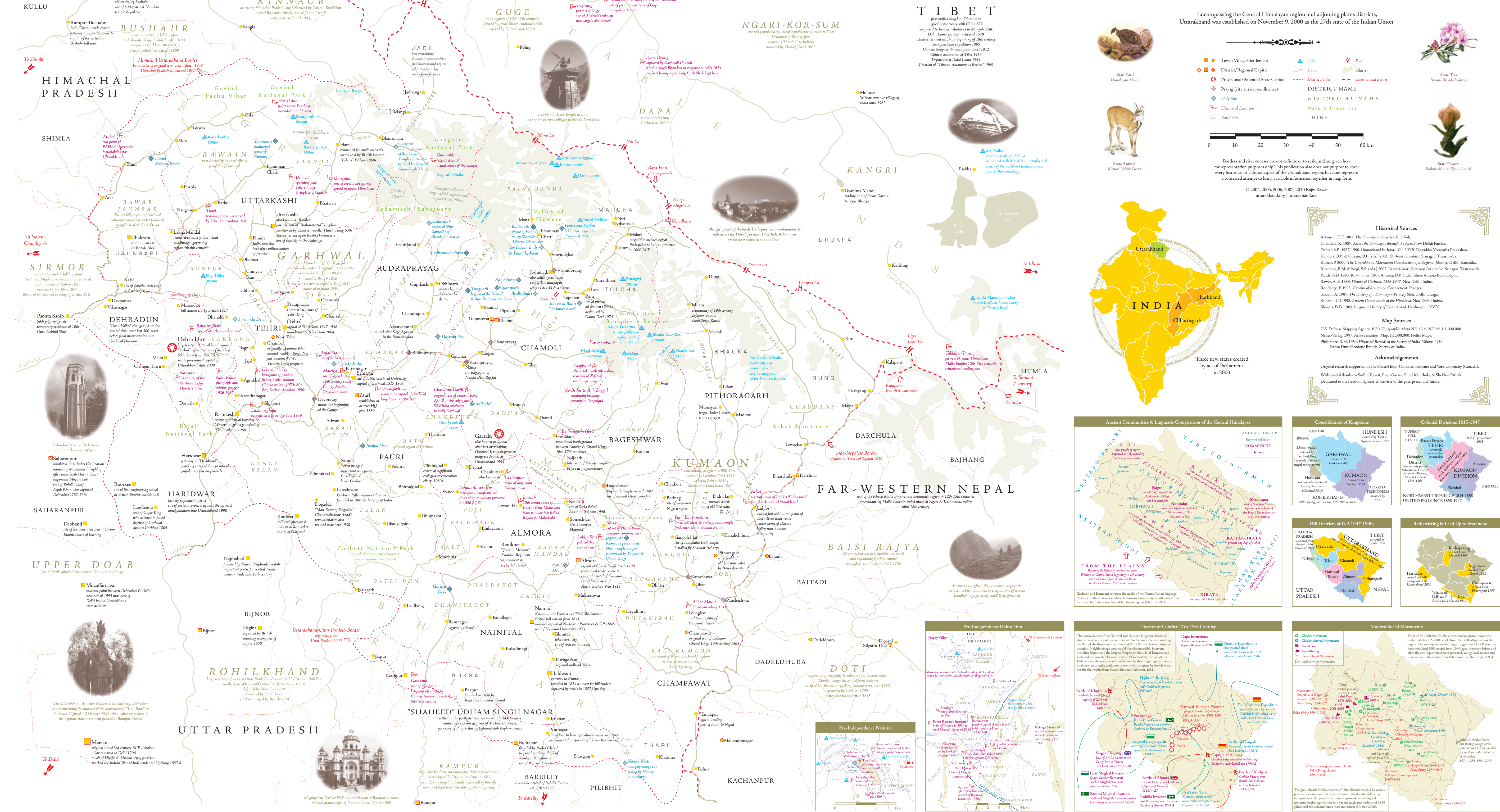

Encapsulating the Central Himalayan region and adjoining plains districts, Uttarakhand was established on November 9, 2000 as the 27th state of the Indian Union. Includes a legend for symbols like Town/Village/Settlement, District/Regional Capital, etc.
